College credit may be earned through approved/accredited articulation agreements, college credit or transfer courses.

Please keep in mind that credits for a specific course may be granted only once.

Students interested in earning credit for AP courses must have AP testing results sent to The University of Scranton (school code 2929). You can specify that your results be sent to us at the time you take the test.

MISSION STATEMENT

The University of Scranton is a Catholic and Jesuit university animated by the spiritual vision and the tradition of excellence characteristic of the Society of Jesus and those who share its way of proceeding. The University is a community dedicated to the freedom of inquiry and personal development fundamental to the growth in wisdom and integrity of all who share its life.

HISTORY

A comprehensive, co-educational, private institution, The University of Scranton was founded in 1888 as Saint Thomas College by the Most Reverend William G. O'Hara, D.D., the first bishop of Scranton. In 1938, it achieved university status, and was entrusted to the care of the Society of Jesus (the Jesuits) in 1942.

THE CAMPUS

The University is in the midst of more than \$85 million in campus improvements. Scranton has built 25 new buildings and renovated 38 others since 1984. The new Patrick & Margaret DeNaples Center, a \$35 million, 118,000 square-foot campus center, opened in January 2008. Also new is Christopher and Margaret Condron Hall, a 386-bed, suite-style residence hall that opened for the fall 2008 semester.

THE REGION

Scranton is nestled in Pennsylvania's Pocono Northeast region, one of the East Coast's premier vacation spots and a growing center for major corporations looking for locations outside of, but still comfortably close to, major metropolitan areas. The University's campus is in the heart of Scranton, a community of 70,000 within a greater metropolitan area of 750,000 people.
