## Basic Demographics


- 619 students:
  - 63.5% Female, 46.5% Male
  - 26% First-years, 29.5% sophomores,
     23% juniors, and 18% seniors
  - 67% on-campus students, 33% off-campus




### Key Findings

- 95% own laptops, up from 89% in 2010.
- 84% reported having a smartphone.
- 54% believed that most or all of their professors use information technology effectively.
- 63% would like more lecture capture.
- 53% would like profs. to use the LMS more.
- 61% would prefer courses with online components









### Instructor technology usage


#### Students reporting most or all of their professors:

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





Smartphones during class?






